

- Disclosure
 - 2020 · Documentary/LGBT · 1h 40m
 - A look at Hollywood's depiction of transgender people and the impact of this on American culture. Directed by Sam Feder, this documentary tackles a full history of transgender representation in Hollywood, one that goes back to early silent era films, and includes Bugs Bunny, "The Jeffersons," "The Silence of the Lambs," FX's "Pose" and more. With hundreds of clips, the doc establishes a long history of images for people who are marginalized to this day, but it faces transphobic media with its cutting analysis—as painful as many misrepresentations in popular culture can be, "Disclosure" is an eloquent wake-up call against clichés (sex workers, murdered characters, psychos) and images that have given everyone the wrong idea.
- Hidden Figures
 - PG 2016 · Drama/History · 2h 7m
 - Three brilliant African-American women at NASA -- Katherine Johnson (Taraji P. Henson), Dorothy Vaughan (Octavia Spencer) and Mary Jackson (Janelle Monáe) -- serve as the brains behind one of the greatest operations in history: the launch of astronaut John Glenn (Glen Powell) into orbit, a stunning achievement that restored the nation's confidence, turned around the Space Race and galvanized the world.
- The Death and Life of Marsha P. Johnson
 - 2017 · Documentary · 1h 45m

- Filmmakers re-examine the 1992 death of transgender legend Marsha P. Johnson, who was found floating in the Hudson River. Originally ruled a suicide, many in the community believe she was murdered.
- Reaching for the Moon
 - 2013 · Romance/Drama · 1h 58m
 - Poet Elizabeth Bishop (Miranda Otto) has a love affair with architect Lota de Macedo Soares (Gloria Pires).
- The Miracle Worker
 - 1962 · Drama/Adaptation · 1h 47m
 - Blind and deaf after suffering a terrible fever as a baby, young Helen Keller (Patty Duke) has spent years unable to communicate, leaving her frustrated and occasionally violent. As a last chance before she is institutionalized, her parents (Inga Swenson, Andrew Prine) contact a school for the blind, which sends half-blind Annie Sullivan (Anne Bancroft) to teach Helen. Helen is initially resistant, but Annie gradually forms a bond with her and shows Helen ways of reaching others.
- On the Basis of Sex
 - PG-13 2018 · Drama/Legal drama · 2 hours
 - Ruth Bader Ginsburg is a struggling attorney and new mother who faces adversity and numerous obstacles in her fight for equal rights. When Ruth takes on a groundbreaking tax case with her husband, attorney Martin Ginsburg, she knows it could change the direction of her career and the way the courts view gender discrimination.

- What Happened, Miss Simone?
 - 2015 · Documentary/Music · 1h 41m
 - Classically trained pianist, dive-bar chanteuse, black power icon and legendary recording artist Nina Simone lived a life of brutal honesty, musical genius, and tortured melancholy.

- Bessie
 - 2015 · Music/Drama · 1h 55m
 - An exploration of the life of Bessie Smith, including her rise to the top in the 1920s, and her status as a legendary blues performer.

- Maurice
 - R 1987 · Romance/Drama · 2h 21m
 - In 1909, Maurice Hall (James Wilby) enters Cambridge, where he befriends wealthy Clive Durham (Hugh Grant). Clive confesses he is sexually attracted to Maurice, who realizes he is a homosexual when he begins to return Clive's feelings. The two embark on an intense but chaste affair to avoid tarnishing Clive's reputation, but eventually, the relationship ends, and Clive marries Anne (Phoebe Nicholls). While visiting Clive, Maurice is drawn toward his friend's servant, Alec Scudder (Rupert Graves).

- Iron Jawed Angels
 - 2004 · Drama/Historical drama · 2h 5m
 - Fiery American suffragette Alice Paul lights a fire under the older women's leaders in Washington DC. President Wilson refuses to give all women the vote, but Paul is prepared to go to prison for her cause.
